Eligibility Requirements:

- Child must be at least 18 mos. old to begin and may continue until they transition into preschool, or until their 3rd birthday.
- While LEAP is specialized for children with diagnosed hearing loss of any type, any child with developmental delays will be considered for LEAP 2 or LEAP 3.
- If your child has a developmental delay affecting cognitive, self-help, social-emotional, communication, and/or motor skills, LEAP is the perfect program for your child and family!

Hear 2 Learn is proud to introduce your family to the Listening Ears at Play (LEAP) program. Our program takes place at Erwin Methodist Church. It is a community-based program as part of your child's Early Intervention Program services. A supportive, language-rich environment for children with developmental delays that gives them the opportunity to continue developing overall skills with peers, and teachers who have their specialized needs in mind.

Contact your service coordinator if your child is already receiving Early Intervention services and are interested adding LEAP to your IFSP.



What to Expect:

- A warm, developmentally appropriate and engaging environment
- Teachers trained in supporting children with hearing loss and other developmental delays using a total communication approach
- Healthy snack provided daily
- Center-time play, circle-time, arts & crafts, and motor time included in the schedule
- Additional IFSP services provided on site (speech, physical, and occupational therapy) as appropriate
- Children are strongly encouraged to wear listening equipment which will be checked daily by trained staff. Adaptive equipment use will also be supported
- Busing available
- Morning and afternoon class times available
